JORDAN SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND

Jordan School District is proposing a bond for \$245 million. This bond amount has changed from \$495 million to \$245 million. This change happened because people like YOU spoke up and voted. As a result they LISTENED and made many changes! One change is that if the bond passes now, the average homeowner will only pay \$16.80 per YEAR.

More than 9,000 students are projected to enroll in the District by 2021-22 school year. With this bond they will build 5 new schools and rebuild West Jordan Middle to help accommodate all of these students.

Because the District wants all of us to be informed and involved, they are hosting several open houses at various schools in September to make it as convenient as possible. 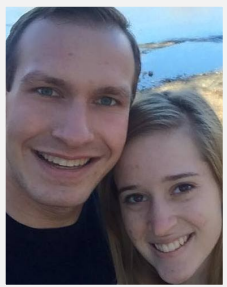
