2. Testing Data

Major Tests: Acadience (formerly DIBELS), End of Year Tests: SAGE & RISE

- Silver Crest improved from 2017-18 where we received a C- to 2018-19 where we received a B-
- Growth score on End of Year testing (RISE & SAGE) is outstanding and the strongest in the district. Our proficiency scores were strong as well
- Growth of our lowest 25% of students was very strong. We received a score of 17, the highest in the district was 19
- Growth of ESL students score was 7, the highest in the district was 9
- On Acadience: 69% of students made typical or better progress, this is the highest score that Silver Crest has received
- On SAGE & RISE: in 2014 ELA scores have increased from 36% proficiency in 2014 to 49% proficiency in 2019. In Math, we have increased from 40% proficiency in 2014 to 48% proficiency in 2019.
- Our student Growth Percentile was 29% higher than the state average
- We credit PLC time and specials, like art, music, & science time which allow teachers time to review students who need extra help and provide interventions to help them improve.

3. Safe Walking Routes Plan

- Concerns: Sidewalks on Old Herriman Main Street is not developed with sidewalks and the city is not planning to do so, per the resident's wishes.
- There will be construction of a Dog Park next to Bobcat Lane, we will direct all students away from this location
- The City is considering moving the crosswalk on Herriman Main Street from the current location to the light on Black Locust Way. The SNAP Committee and members of the SCC have safety concerns about moving this crosswalk and crossing guard to that intersection. The concern is that kids will need to cross the driveways of Knots on Main, the Library, and the Rec Center without a crossing guard. We took an informal vote in this meeting of SCC members, all 11 present were in favor of keeping the crosswalk at the current location.
